

Brisa is stuck waiting tables and can't find work in her field until luck changes. She lands a contract as a sculptor at an architecture firm specializing in roundabouts. At first, everything seems perfect: she is given more responsibility and makes genuine friends among her colleagues.

The only mystery is Junior, the firm's director. Always smiling and radiating "positive vibes," he hides behind a polished façade. But what does he actually do all day besides water the plants? When his father, the company's owner and main investor, pressures him, Junior's permanent grin fades. As manipulation and abuse of power escalate, Brisa realizes that even dream jobs have a dark side and that no role is worth giving up your boundaries.





In this factory in deep Spain, the dull gray of cement contrasts with the sweet scent of ripe fruit. A colorful group of coworkers runs the canning line: Juli, an unmotivated biology student repeatedly failing her final exam; Rita, who has just learned her partner is infertile; Carmen, whose husband's controlling behavior is beginning to worry the others; and Paqui, who has worked there for as long as she can remember and is now nearing retirement.

Every morning at eleven, the women gather to eat sandwiches and debate the virtues of chorizo. Beneath their identical hairnets, age and background vanish, and their fears, frustrations, and unspoken truths suddenly feel easier to carry as they stare together at the apricot fields stretching out behind the factory.

Setting Up a Festival in Morocco: A Journey Through Sonic and Cultural Mixing





Can guilt ever be transformed into something meaningful?

A graphic novel about WWII, in the vein of Nora Krug and Rutu Modan Anna-Lina Mattar delves into her father's memories, who still struggles with the guilt of his German heritage. During the war, the village where her family lived endured a series of upheavals: first, the men were sent to the front; then, Polish prisoners of war arrived to work the farms; and finally, after the armistice, the British army occupied the region. Food was scarce, fear was constant but the burden of guilt was even harder to shake.


A haunting legacy symbolized by the snakeshaped ring that Anna-Lina's grandmother found under the cushion of a sofa taken from the "emptied" house of a deported Jewish neighbour and that she wore until the end of her life. A quiet reminder that the past is never fully left behind.

Debunking the Myth: a bold NF graphic novel to break old spells




Concrete


A quirky graphic novel about burnout, isolation, and the healing power of friendship.




























Dog Park


A queer fantasy that reimagines Dante Alighieri's Divine Comedy through a gendered lens.


A graphic reportage of Brazil's greatest environmental disaster






Mona Lisa in the metro




Vicious Pop


A viral video exposes a young girl's privacy with dramatic consequences.






