Based in Vienna, **Anamarija Kvas** is a Croatian artist, specializing in comics and printmaking. She holds a master's degree from the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb, with additional studies in Leipzig and Prague. She also co-organizes the OHOHO Festival of Comics and Street Art in Zagreb.

This year, she has been selected for the Cross Residency for Comics between France and Croatia, a project supported by the French Institute in Croatia and Cité internationale de la bande dessinée et de l'image in Angoulême.

The childhood friends Dorotea and Lucia grew up on the picturesque, fishing island of Mutare, a place steeped in traditions, where legends and ancient beliefs remain firmly rooted. Lucia, who now goes by Luka and identifies as male, always dreamed of escaping the narrow-minded island. Yet it was Dorotea who eventually left with her parents, while Luka remained behind.

Now that mass tourism gradually erodes Mutare's fragile ecological and economical system, more and more young people depart in search of opportunities on the mainland. Luka, working as a guide in the island's natural park, has grown resigned to the locals' quiet defeat. The days pass slowly, filled with card games among the few friends who remain and


evenings spent with the elderly, who dwell on how much better life was in the past.

When Dorotea suddenly returns to Mutare, she brings with her a breath of change. Planning to turn her old family home into an artist residency, she hopes to restore new life and culture to the community. As Luka and Dorotea reconnect and new feelings emerge, tensions on the island rise: the winter ferry service faces severe cuts, leaving the island more isolated than ever, while unchecked tourism threatens to push Mutare to the brink of collapse.



DAVID "EL DEE" ESPINOSA

David Espinosa, known in the art scene as **El Dee**, is a Mexican comic artist and author whose work centers on nostalgia, chosen families, and resorting to tenderness in the face of adversity. Born by the beach and now living in the shadow of volcanoes, he studied Design in Puebla. His artwork

has been featured at the Guadalajara International Book Fair, and his comics are published in original language by Planeta México. El Dee gained popularity with his quirky webcomic *Death and I*, which imagines his everyday life flat-sharing with the hooded Grim Reaper.

An urban Latin noir, full of punks and punches, that captures the recklessness of a youth on the brink of adulthood.


Efrén is a little nervous about leaving the town where he grew up to study in another city. This means saying goodbye to his two best friends. As different as they are, the three have been inseparable since childhood, bound together by their passion for music and their punk band. Their last summer together is meant to be full of wild parties, skating through town, and chilling at the beach.

Things take a darker turn when they are caught accidentally witnessing a drug delivery. Now narcos and corrupt tourist police are coming after them, when all they wanted was to have some fun. The three friends are yet determined to let no one ruin their farewell concert.

This coming-of-age adventure, set at the pivotal moment of leaving adolescence behind, celebrates the idealistic bravery we often forget to summon later in life on.

GLÀFIRA SMITH

Glàfira Smith studied film in Edinburgh before continuing her career in the audiovisual field as a director and creative lead in Barcelona.

In 2020, she published her first comic, *Secrets de mare* (*Mother's Secret*), with Norma Editorial. In 2022, she received the Ara Prize for a short comic in Catalan

with her story *Els homes són llops* (*Men Are Wolves*), a powerful exploration of gender-based violence told through personal experiences and global data on misogynistic violence. Her work centers around intimate narratives that reveal broader social issues, combined with innovative visual storytelling.

Trufa

Dogs don't perceive colors the way we do. They also see the world differently: their gaze is more intense, empathetic, and generous. Through the eyes of Trufa, a black Labrador, we are immersed in the daily life of a "regular" family. José Luis is a dependable husband and father, a provider and hard worker. You can count on him in good times, but when it comes to emotional matters, he remains distant and withdrawn.


Exploring the many forms love can take, this is a sensitive family chronicle, where other stories quietly emerge: that of an aging couple, a mother diminished by a long illness, and a daughter trying to break through the silence of a father who avoids intimacy.

Half puzzled, half amused, Smith offers a nuanced portrait of those father figures we often admired growing up but never truly understood. Many children of the postwar generation have struggled to connect with parents who stubbornly looked forward, perhaps because behind them there was only rubble and death. She does so with love, through the unjudging eyes of Trufa, portraying both José Luis's presence and his absences. The result is as moving as it is liberating.



LUCKAS IOHANATHAN

Luckas Iohanathan was born in the city of Mossoró, in the interior of the Brazilian state of Rio Grande do Norte.

He studied Social Communication and Advertising but his true passion is, of course, storytelling through comics. In them, he connects the psychological with the mythical.

His narratives often explore trauma employing magical realism or fantasy to navigate the blurred lines between reality and imagination, examining how belief shapes human behavior.

Ouroboros

When the body of a newborn is discovered in a dumpster, Kesler, a police officer about to become a father, is shaken to his core. The case opens up wounds of his own traumatic childhood and drives him back to the house where he grew up, forcing him to confront his complex relationship with his mother. It's a place he left behind, determined to become a better person than she ever was but now, sitting in front of the aging woman, Kesler begins to understand that closure isn't found in forgetting, but in facing what was never resolved. Will it be enough though to escape the circle of violence and abuse?


From Jabuti Award-winning author Luckas Iohanathan comes a haunting family drama that explores how the past endlessly coils into the present, like the mythical snake biting its own tail. He captures the cyclical nature of trauma delivering a deeply human story about memory, guilt, and the weight of inherited pain.

Told through a seamless, color-coded narrative that blurs temporalities, the graphic novel uses a cold, minimalist palette to reflect the emotional landscape of characters who live in moral gray zones. With unforgettable, flawed figures and a final gut-punch twist, Ouroboros confirms why Iohanathan is one of the most powerful voices in contemporary Brazilian comics.

LUIS SAFAH

Luis Safah is an award-winning multidisciplinary artist from Mexico. He has been selected for the International Comic Residency at the Cité de la Bande Dessinée et de l’Image (Angoulême) and at Casa del Autor (Zapopan). His publications and graphic work have traveled to Sweden, Los Angeles, New Orleans, and Spain.

Luis explores the relationship between image and narrative through both digital and analog processes, creating visual worlds that address themes of the human condition - or rather the end of it - and contemporary dilemmas with a subtle sense of humor.

Not a volcano

In a not-so-distant future, an apocalyptic event known as the GDD (Global Digital Disconnection) has reshaped the world, leaving only 10% of living beings alive.

In this new world order, the survivors struggle to endure the aftermath, where the destruction of the Amazon is celebrated and the use of plastic is glorified.


A small group of young people, however, still remembers the past and refuses to comply with the dominant logic of unrestrained capitalism. In an immersive, feverish dream, they set out for the factory district, determined to bring it down.

Even as smoke relentlessly rises from its summit, this place is anything but a volcano. It is, in fact, the opposite of an eruption: instead of destruction giving way to renewal, it's a system that exhausts the land without allowing life to return.



Everyone knows Siri, the world's most famous voice assistant. But what if she were a real person, made of flesh and blood?

In Cartu's elegant and futuristic graphic novel, her life is filled with mundane routines: endless commutes, precarious mini-jobs, insomnia, anxiety, an unexpected pregnancy scare and an addiction to documentaries about orcas.

The comic's sleek panels integrates hypertext, allowing the reader to navigate the frames as they would on a computer or phone screen, reinforcing the impression of the fragmented reality of our digital age and its paradoxes. How do we communicate and how do we live in a permanently connected, yet often lonely, society?







Following a residency at La Maison des Auteurs in Angoulême, where she began developing

a new graphic novel project about the Argentine dictatorship, she was awarded a Pro Helvetia South America grant for an artist residency in Zürich in 2025.

NACHA VOLLENWEIDER

Volver is inspired by a mythical Argentine tango. Volver also means “homecoming.” After six years in Hamburg, Nacha returns home. Argentina is still deeply affected by the economic crisis and she is processing the recent divorce from her German wife, trying to make sense of her time in Europe.

Collecting pagan deities in Brazil; backpacking in the Argentine Sierras with a Swiss friend who idealizes Latin America; engaging in intense conversations with her grandmother, a nostalgic supporter of Peronism: Nacha embarks on a journey to reconnect with both her country and herself.

In a time when political, economic, and environmental crisis are forcing people to migrate from their home countries, which fractures do these uprootings leave, both on a personal and global level? Sometimes, coming back is just as hard as leaving.


